# **3** Description

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The 'LV165A devices are parallel-load, 8-bit shift registers designed for 2-V to 5.5-V V<sub>CC</sub> operation.

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When the devices are clocked, data is shifted toward the serial output Q<sub>H</sub>. Parallel-in access to each stage is provided by eight individual direct data inputs that are enabled by a low level at the shift/load (SH/LD) input. The 'LV165A devices feature a clock-inhibit function and a complemented serial output,  $\overline{Q}_{H}$ .


Clocking is accomplished by a low-to-high transition of the clock (CLK) input while SH/LD is held high and clock inhibit (CLK INH) is held low. The functions of CLK and CLK INH are interchangeable. Since a low CLK and a low-to-high transition of CLK INH accomplishes clocking, ČLK INH must be changed to the high level only while CLK is high. Parallel loading is inhibited when SH/LD is held high. The parallel inputs to the register are enabled while SH/LD is held low, independently of the levels of CLK, CLK INH, or SER.

These devices are fully specified for partial-powerdown applications using Ioff. The Ioff circuitry disables the outputs, preventing damaging current backflow through the devices when they are powered down.

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





#### Figure 2. Load Circuit and Voltage Waveforms




# 8 Detailed Description

#### 8.1 Overview

The 'LV165A devices are parallel-load, 8-bit shift registers designed for 2-V to 5.5-V V<sub>CC</sub> operation.

When the devices are clocked, data is shifted toward the serial output Q<sub>H</sub>. Parallel-in access to each stage is provided by eight individual direct data inputs that are enabled by a low level at the shift/load (SH/LD) input. The <sup>2</sup>LV165A devices feature a clock-inhibit function and a complemented serial output,  $\overline{Q}_{H}$ .




Figure 4. Typical Shift, Load, and Inhibit Sequences

#### 8.3 Feature Description

The wide operating range allows the device to be used in a variety of systems that use different logic levels. The low propagation delay allows fast switching and higher speeds of operation. In addition, the low ground bounce stabilizes the performance of non-switching outputs while another output is switching.

#### 9.1 Application Information

The SN74LV165A is a low drive CMOS device that can be used for a multitude of bus interface type applications where output ringing is a concern. The low-drive and slow-edge rates minimize overshoot and undershoot on the outputs.

#### 9.2 Typical Application




Figure 5. Input Expansion with Shift Registers

#### 9.2.1 Design Requirements

This device uses CMOS technology and has balanced output drive. Take care to avoid bus contention because it can drive currents that can exceed maximum limits. The high drive also creates fast edges into light loads so consider routing and load conditions to prevent ringing.

#### 9.2.2 Detailed Design Procedure

Recommended input conditions:

- Rise time and fall time specs. See the *Recommended Operating Conditions* section,  $(\Delta t/\Delta V)$
- Specified high and low level. See the *Recommended Operating Conditions* section, (V<sub>IH</sub> and V<sub>IL</sub>)
- Inputs are overvoltage tolerant allowing them to go as high as 5.5 V at any valid  $V_{CC}$


Recommended output conditions:

- Load currents must not exceed 25 mA per output and 50 mA total for the part.
- Outputs must not be pulled above V<sub>CC</sub>.

### **10 Power Supply Recommendations**

The power supply can be any voltage between the minimum and maximum supply voltage rating located in the *Absolute Maximum Ratings* section. Each V<sub>CC</sub> terminal must have a good bypass capacitor to prevent power disturbance. For devices with a single supply, TI recommends a 0.1- $\mu$ F capacitor and if there are multiple V<sub>CC</sub> terminals then TI recommends a 0.01- $\mu$ F or 0.022- $\mu$ F capacitor for each power terminal. Multiple bypass capacitors can be paralleled to reject different frequencies of noise. Frequencies of 0.1  $\mu$ F and 1  $\mu$ F are commonly used in parallel. The bypass capacitor must be installed as close as possible to the power terminal for best results.

### 11 Layout

#### 11.1 Layout Guidelines

When using multiple bit logic devices inputs must never float.

In many cases, functions or parts of functions of digital logic devices are unused, for example, when only two inputs of a triple-input AND gate are used or only three of the four buffer gates are used. Such input pins must not be left unconnected because the undefined voltages at the outside connections result in undefined operational states. Specified below are the rules that must be observed under all circumstances. All unused inputs of digital logic devices must be connected to a high or low bias to prevent them from floating. The logic level that must be applied to any particular unused input depends on the function of the device. Generally they are tied to GND or  $V_{CC}$  whichever make more sense or is more convenient. Floating outputs is generally acceptable, unless the part is a transceiver. If the transceiver has an output enable pin it disables the outputs section of the part when asserted. This does not disable the input section of the IOs so they also cannot float when disabled.




Figure 8. Layout Example





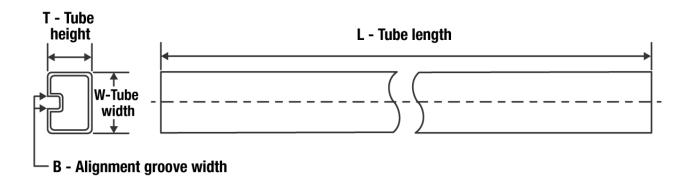
